## **Tribute to Toris Jaeger**

This year the Orinda Olive Festival opened with a tribute to Toris Jaeger and her 40 years of teaching children in the Nature Area. A founding member of the Friends of the Wagner Ranch Nature Area, Terry Slaman, described how Toris has a deep respect for biodiversity and Earth systems. With her quiet guidance, thousands of children have learned to love nature and explore local history. Orinda Mayor, Victoria Smith, spoke to how Toris has served the community for many years, and Ann Alton described how she encouraged Toris to apply for the job of District Naturalist in the mid-1970s. Miriam Storch, a former student in the Nature Area programs, referred to a Native American quote "The wind cannot defeat a tree with deep roots," saying that through all the wind over the years, Toris kept her feet planted firmly on the ground and kept the nature area alive. Esther Railton Rice, Ed. D. wrote in her letter about Toris, "At the Nature Area, Toris found her niche and has dedicated her life to this piece of land and the children who learn on it. Her warmth, gratitude to those who help her and selflessness make her one of the most joyous and warmest of my career memories." Toris often tells us that the looks of wonder on the faces of her "Nature Detectives" feed her soul. Directed by Dr. Jim, the students of the Academy of Language Arts and Music (A.L.M.A.) led the audience in a refrain of "Happy Anniversary to You."

## 7<sup>th</sup> Orinda Olive Festival Gets Underway

Hundreds of children and adults gathered to celebrate the Nature Area and its 133 year-old historic olive grove. Amphora Nueva from Lafayette returned for a second year providing visitors with a wonderful variety of extra virgin olive oil and balsamic vinegars. Berkeley Olive Grove showcased its award winning organic olive oil, and a variety of California olives and olive oils were tasted by visitors at the *All About Olives* station in the olive grove. Kricket Nissen treated visitors to the aromas and textures of olive soaps and lotions at the Raw Soap booth.

Children received *Olive Passports* to take to 30 activity stations for a nature stamp. They were rewarded with honey sticks for having their Passports stamped at 10 stations. Embracing the theme of olives and peace, children and adults wore leafy olive crowns, which they crafted from fresh boughs. The Orinda Juniorettes were very busy decorating faces, and other popular activities included: Nature Tattoos by Coyote Brush, Decorating Tiles, and a variety of olive games, for which Bell Carter – Lindsay Olives provided their delicious olives as prizes.

Back by popular demand the Orinda Ukulele Players enticed visitors in through the Grove Gate and entertained them with lively tunes and sing-a-longs. Visitors could also enjoy Zamboni's Pizza and visit a variety of activities including the very popular Nature Art with artist Jennifer White and BOGOS Art with the Strickler family. Local Plein Air artist, Sylvia Fones painted the grove scene, as families watched her at work.
